Immanuel's Partnership with Washington Middle School

Immanuel has found many ways recently to fulfill our mission of helping Washington Middle School students learn the satisfaction of community service and to assist WMS students who are most needing our help.

On April 1, after school, <u>Immanuel sponsored the first</u> "Creating Across Generations" workshop at Missoula Manor. As part of the WMS Flagship Program,

these workshops are bringing together residents of Missoula Manor and Washington Middle School students on Mondays after school to help each other create craft projects. Five students have signed up to participate, and each week Manor residents sign up to take part as well. There were six Manor res-



idents at the first workshop which was led by Carol Fleharty and her daughter Kristen who taught the group how to make Scandinavian-style bookmarks. Carol and Kristen were assisted by Tove Elvrom, Nancy Melby, Judy Wellert, and Tudi



Smith. Both the Manor residents and the students had a great time! The students were very well-behaved and jumped right into the project. They were pleased with their creations, and, on the way back to Washington, one twelve-year-old exclaimed how proud he was to

have helped one of the Manor residents make her bookmark.

One of the ways we show Jesus' love to the students is to simply be a caring, trustworthy adult who listens to their life story with encouragement and without judgement. Twelve-year-olds reveal a lot of personal issues when they re in a non-threatening environment. It was touching to hear one of the boys talk casually about his complicated family situationLall his many siblings are in foster care, and he has never met his mother, but she calls him occasionally.



On April 8 Carrol Karlsgodt will be leading the Greating Across Generations+workshop teaching how to make fleece blankets, and on April 15 Tove Elvrom will lead a workshop on making cloth

origami bunnies and paper Easter eggs. If these workshops go well, Immanuel will do more after school in the autumn term.

Recently, Immanuel members manned a table for two entire days at the Washington Middle School Community Service Fair and had the opportunity to tell all the WMS students about their opportunities to do community service work at Immanuel. Two WMS students came



to Immanuel and helped sort and pack Baby Care
Kits for Lutheran World Relief, AND six Immanuel members helped chaperone a group of 75
WMS eighth-graders as they packed 3700 packets of food at the Missoula Food Bank! Two of our members used a Thrivent Action Team grant to shop for food and toiletries to stock the shelves in Washington's Families in Transition room, where WMS families experiencing homelessness can find some supplies.

Immanuel is making a positive difference in our neighborhood, helping with a wide variety of needs.


