Singing a New Song of Faith

Music holds us and holds us together. We connect to God, one another, and our ancestors in faith through shared songs. So, what happens when we introduce new music? Music we don't know, words we've never sung together,

unfamiliar tunes. It's like anything else new, it has the potential to make us cautious or to open a whole world of possibilities and ideas.

For Lent this year we are using a new setting of the Vespers (evening prayer) liturgy that comes to us from Holden Village called Bless This Night (Vespers '23). It's unfamiliar, has rhythms and words that get jumbled in our mouths, we're hesitant to sing. But even this unfamiliarity offers a gift. A chance to slow down, to consider lyrics more carefully, to tune our ears to how the melody and words dance together to express something far great that each individually.

From the music itself, here are a few lines that continue to resonate in my soul after each Wednesday of singing it in community:

... As the day turns to dusk, prepare us to receive night's blessings

... We embrace deep mystery, loved by God and full of worth

... When I see the mountains, I remember my creator
... God has seen my lowliness and blessed me. I will serve.

... In hardship and in peril, stay with us.

May the songs of faith, old and new, keep singing in our hearts. May they and open possibilities and ideas that guide us along our journey of faith, individually and collectively during this Lenten season!

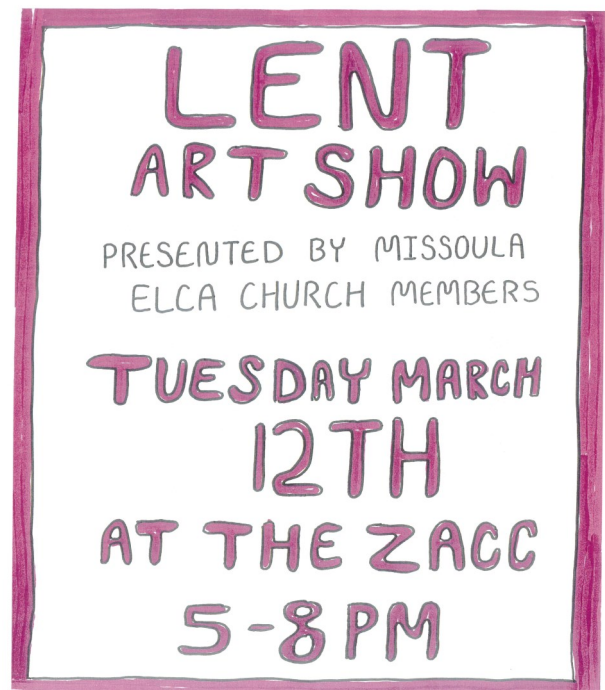

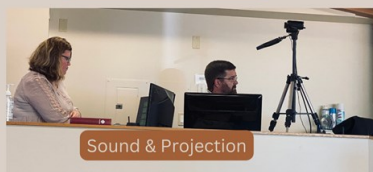

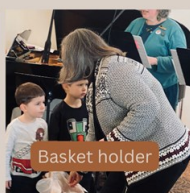

Family Promise Update

Nancy Marks

In February, I attended the Family Promise Report Card where we talked about the progress we made in 2023 and where we are headed in 2024.



In 2023:

Prevention-

106 individuals were supported to maintain their housing with only 4 families who went into the Family Housing Center. 167 families were supported through the walk-in Room with Housing Advocate Network support.

Shelter

343 people were served at the Family Housing center
164 adults
179 children
80 children were under 5
52% exited into positive housing destinations
Average length of stay- 96
10,400 meals were served-
5 days a week for all of 2023 Family Promise provided a meal

Stabilization

60 families received Welcome Baskets

45 families participated in the Giving Tree Sponsorship at Christmas

We came to an agreement with the YWCA to provide opportunities for families with children to volunteer for the Family Fun Activities and the Story Time sessions.

Adventuring into 2024 we have several things that we are working on.

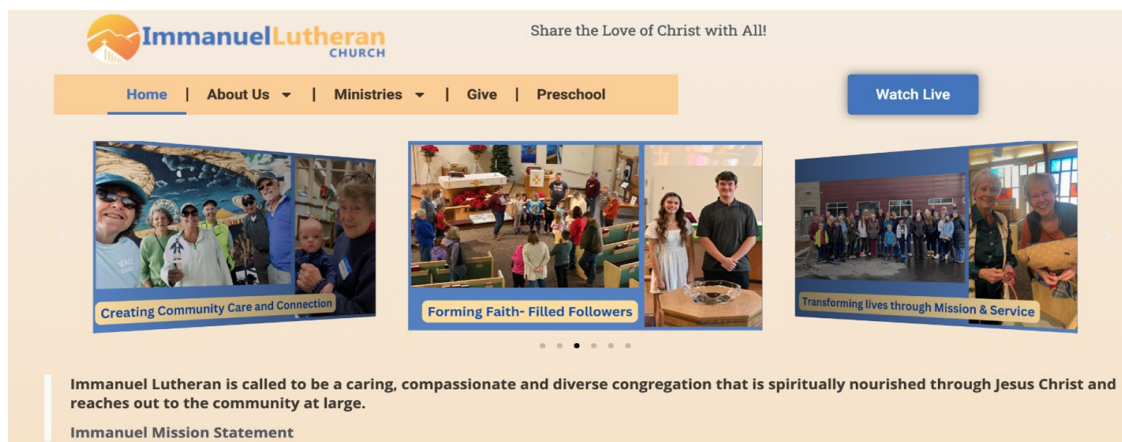

IMLU Annual Meeting

Sunday January 28, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 11:15 am by Council President Ike Marks
The opening prayer and litany was led by P. Molly and P. Rebekah

Approval of 2022 annual meeting minutes: Motion made by Georgia Cobbs with a second by Susannah Murphy. Motion passed by acclamation

Attendance:60

Mission and Ministries video by Nancy Marks

Loving God through worship and music: Marilyn Hall Thank you to everyone who has helped and for all those wanting to help going forward. If training is needed, please see Marilyn.

Creating Community Care and Connection: Ike Marks 22% of annual spending serving on council, prayer shawls, 125 celebration, became an RIC congregation, visitation and caring for each other and the community around us.

Transforming Lives Through Mission and Service: Nancy Marks reviewing of the many different ways we serve our community, Family Promise, baby care kits, Washington middle school, Giving Tree, apple trees, Habitat for Humanity, blood drives, Thrivent action grants, Rob and Carolee Stuberger in Tanzania and scholarships for their students.

Forming Faith Filled Followers: Ray Smith 23% of income spent here We called an associate pastor, advent devotions, Family Faith Gatherings, confirmation teaching mentoring, book studies, youth camps, partnered with MIC and Emmaus for various events

Review of benevolence: food donations, communion bread/wine, food for all our different events, Giving Tree items, office furniture for the new minister, hall cleaning and painting, housewarming gifts, lawn care maintenance, decorations, little library, postage, loft remodel, ceiling repair, dish room, website maintenance.

Giving and benevolence: Endowment fund \$15,547 to a variety of activities here and in the world beyond-retreats, bible camp scholarships, gifts of money to others given through our church \$14,465 given beyond pledges budget \$23,686 to Montana synod \$1,776 to MIC Thrivent action grants (any member can supply up to 500 per year easy to do) Family Promise welcome baskets, devotion printings, bible study books, \$4,000 given by Thrivent to fund things we know are important \$1,000 special grant \$500 from Town Pump from Thrivent for giving \$55,000 80% ends up going beyond these walls.

EAR campaign 57 households \$473,000 for EAR campaign end of 2022 30% has been received by 2023 36% by end of 2023 we have received 2/3 of our goal/pledges \$40,000 in savings in checking \$27,000 \$86,000 in EAR campaign paid down principle \$82,000 for brand new roof, \$70,000 solar panels got grant for \$51,000 (we paid the original amount then received a rebate back), paid 1/2 of gutters, \$3,000 for equipment/materials for loft build \$58,000 in savings is being used for mortgage payment \$5,100/mth.

Endowment started in 1994 balance approximately \$450,000 to \$500,000 more precise balance in February; Habitat asking for \$5,000, women's retreat, chapel benches, fund has a lot of variety can also donate to the fund.

Strategic plan review : focus to align our gifts and resources to share the love of Christ with all - reaching diverse people and families creating Christian care and community leading the future church embracing a place for all people always open to new ideas.

Julie preschool report: always had two classes post covid has been a little difficult on the preschool probably due to mostly full-time working parents numbers have been down. Decided to combine one class for 3-5 year olds it's been great. Classes have been full. Was going to retire but God seems to have different plans. Classes t-th parents are now recruiting new families and raising tuition only two openings for next year keep going at least one more year take it a year at a time. (Cont. on next page)

(Annual Minutes Cont.)

New Business: nomination report floor opened to nominations none Georgia Cobbs made a motion to accept slate as offered Albert Melby second approved by acclamation slate accepted as written. Thanks to Ike for six years of being president.

2023 ministry spending: Tana Lambert: income \$308,570 expenses \$302,975 added \$5,595 to checking even though mid-year we added P. Rebekah as our 1/4 time Associate Pastor which increased our budget by \$12,625 and we still have a surplus!

2024: detailed budget is available income \$306,513 expenses \$338,339 gave 6.25% raise to all full-time employees The large jump in budget is due to having our 1/4 time associate pastor in the budget for the full year. We anticipate a possible deficit of \$31,826 but we can take from savings if we need to cover deficit. \$66,394 in cash on hand utilities will go down with addition of solar panels. Fun to watch that one go down. Thank you to Tudi for the last nine years as full time bookkeeper. She has gone above and beyond. Kara Schultz is currently being trained and will be a wonderful replacement.

Motion by Mick Hanson to approve 2024 ministry spending, Marilyn Hall second, passed by acclamation.

Recycling Georgia Cobbs: \$250 Thrivent grant proposal to get bins Republic updated proposal collect once a month no sorting drop solid waste cost new proposal \$20/less per month even with additional recycling fuel surcharge cost different month to month.

FMLA for P. Molly in February to figure out a schooling plan for Luke P. Rebekah will take on extra hours for a total of 32 hours/week lots of other folks to do visitation. Thank you for love/support. Leave will be 2/12 through 3/12.

P Rebekah: Thanks you to everyone who had a part in pulling off another wonderful Annual Meeting! To Ike, Tana, Marilyn, and Ray for presenting their pieces in such clear and compelling ways. It is an enormous blessing to be a part of a congregation where the Annual Meeting is a time of celebration rather than stress. RIC Sunday on 2/4 was well received. The RIC committee did an excellent job setting up, leading, and giving the congregation creative opportunities to engage with the question of how we reflect Immanuel's expansive welcome in worship. Thank you to Susannah for sewing the rainbow banners. The "talk back" after the service was a helpful addition to RIC Sunday and allowed people to express their questions, affirmations, and concerns about pieces of the service (especially the different language used). Several folks asked if we could do "talk backs" more often and I plan to incorporate them once per season/quarter. Camp Sunday was 2/11 and included the presentation of bibles to children who hadn't yet received one from Immanuel. It has been a while since we gave out Bibles, which usually are given to 3rd graders, so there were many more kids than usual. Pastor Molly offered a "Get to know your Bible" class after worship for the kids who received them. I was out of town that Sunday, so Sonja would have the official numbers for how many bibles were given. Pastor Molly is on Family Leave from 2/12-3/12. I will be covering all pastoral care emergencies, worship leadership, and everyday matters. About \$20 each. Lent Art Show at Zootown Arts Community Center (ZACC) was reserved to display art created by our FFG group. March 12 5-8 pm. the theme is "Promises" anyone is welcome to submit pieces!

Stewardship: No report

Service: Family Promise: Thanks for help in January for rotation. Family Promise meeting on Tuesday Feb 6th to share where we've been, where we are going in 2024. Stacey Pollard from National Family Promise will be there. All are welcome! RSVP through Nancy Marks. Rebecca Pettit is the director. PJ Willitt is the manager. The Poverello is paid \$60,000 for meals so there is a team working on other options. Prevention, diversion, shelter, stabilization - how do we help families from needing to come back, 107 families were served and 52% were exited into positive housing. 42% is the average so we're doing better than the average. Need to work on the follow through/follow-up. **Cooking and Crafting:** We will begin our new semester on February 8th. All new students this semester. We will have 3rd thru 6th graders. Around 10 to 12 students. I'll be sending out a request for more volunteers to assist us in the coming weeks. Baby Care Kits - Information will be in the Immanuelite about this year's LWR baby care kit collection during February and March. Reminders will be sent in weekly emails Collection sites will be set up soon. Deb will be looking for volunteers and donations. Nancy Solum is willing to help with online ordering. Will send a separate article about switching to another LWR ministry for next year. **Blood Drive:** next one schedule for May 9 and hopefully 1st Thursday in November.

Habitat: The joy of home ownership was realized in January when Lynn Spotted Wolfe and her grandchildren received the keys to their home in East Missoula. Lynn feels the blessings of God to be able to provide a safe and comfortable home for her grandchildren. Ground breaking for the Franklin to Fort triplex property occurs in February. Pre-constructed wall panels allow for construction of the units to be completed by the beginning of summer.

Supporting low-income families with repairs and renovations is still active during the winter months. Home owners needing assistance can reach out to Habitat for more information. Volunteers who can offer their help are always appreciated. Learn more at habitatmissoula.org. Welcome to Angela Fiedler as Service Chair—will be scheduling evening meeting sometime before end of the month.

Worship/Music: The Lent theme will be "Treasure the Promise". Would like to have the pews facing each other so that the people are facing each other and tilted toward the center. Move the altar to the center. Want to move the font to the front entrance of the sanctuary. Might also move the pulpit if that can be done with the electronics/wiring. February 11th to move around the whole sanctuary. People will be fed so hopefully they come. Wonderful ideas about decorating. It will be through Lent but potentially through Easter. The intent is to see each other.

There will be a Wednesday service during Lent in a contemplative/reflective type of service. Changing from pews to chairs are on hold because there might have been too much change at once. There are dedicated funds for that but still need to figure out how that might work.

Fellowship: No report

New/Old Business: EAR - no update. Annual meeting went well. Recycling proposal - it is going to cost less than our current program for garbage alone for the two combined! Pick-up will be first Thursday of every month. There is a large recycling bin in the basement area. The Thrivent grant will be used to buy smaller bins scattered throughout the building. The grant also helped pay for the first months bill. Looking for volunteers to collect the bins and get everything organized for the monthly pick-up.
