

Advent & Christmas 2024

Advent is a season of endings and beginnings. Christ comes in the holy birth and in the fullness of time. The old ways of sin and death have ended; we live and love in new ways. Yet, we feel the weight of many things coming to an end. "Words for the Beginning" will offer blessings we need to hear again and again. We hear scriptures often used in weddings, ordination services, or baptisms. We invite you to enter this Advent season as if you are entering a sacred new chapter, holding fast to the reminders that will bolster you for the journey ahead.



FOR THE BEGINNING

Matthew 1:18-25 | Luke 1:46-55

This traditional quilt square design is called "birds in the air." Sometimes when we take a risk, hope takes flight. It may feel like you're falling, but you'll find that, in God's embrace, you are flying.



Hope is vulnerable and can feel like a tremendous risk, especially if you've experienced loss or trauma. But Mary shows us a resilient hope that takes risks—she risks her body to bear a son who will become the hope of her people. Similarly, Joseph makes a risky choice to stay with Mary; dismissing her quietly would have kept him safe. But instead, he chooses hope. He chooses to trust the angel, and it makes all the difference. It can feel safer and easier to be a cynic, but the world doesn't need more cynics. It needs people who say, "It can be better" and make it so.
