Invocation

Blessed be the holy Trinity, + one God, Who forgives all our sin, Whose mercy endures forever. **Amen**

Confession of Sin

We begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance and for God's mercy. We are created to live in the joy of communion with God, to love one another, and to live in harmony with creation. But our sin separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, so that we do not enjoy the life our Creator intended. By our sin, we grieve God, who does not desire us to come into judgment, but who desires us to turn to God and live.

Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.

Silence for reflection and self-examination.

Using Psalm 51:1-12 & Psalm 139:1-14

The bold text will be read by the pulpit side. The light text will be read by the piano side.

Have mercy on me, O God,

according to your steadfast love;

according to your abundant mercy,

blot out my transgressions.

Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity,

and cleanse me from my sin. (Psalm 51)

You have searched me, LORD,

and you know me.

You know when I sit and when I rise;

you perceive my thoughts from afar. (Psalm 139)


Ash Wednesday: Marked with the Sign of the Cross

Ashes are a rich symbol rooted in ancient Jewish customs and practices. Ashes represent frailty, humility, repentance, sorrow, mourning, cleansing and renewal. Glitter (biodegradable, cosmetic-grade) has been added to the ashes to represent another side of our humanity – goodness, joy, and belovedness – a reminder that we are made of earth dust *and* star dust. As these ashes are applied to the forehead in the form of a cross, the following words are said, "remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return." These words echo words from the burial of the dead and final committal "earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust." The service continues with Jesus' instructions for the disciplines of the Christian life.

Invitation to Lent Beginning with Ash Wednesday, we enter the time of Lent; 40 days to mark Jesus' journey to the cross and his Passover from death to life. As disciples of Jesus, we are called to a discipline that contends against evil and resists whatever leads us away from love of God and neighbor. The disciplines of Lent are self-examination and repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love; disciplines we are able to do as we are strengthened by the gifts of word and sacrament.

Each person is marked with a cross of ashes, the minister says: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Accomplish in us, O God, the work of your salvation.

That we may show forth your glory in the world.

By the cross and passion of your Son, our Lord.

Bring us with all your saints the joy of his resurrection.

Almighty God does not desire the death of sinners. God desires that we may turn from evil and live. In humility we ask God to grant us true repentance, faith, and the gift of the Holy Spirit, until at last we may come to God's eternal joy; through Jesus Christ, our Lord. **Amen.**


